God has established a framework within which He rules and reigns within His church. I do not believe in dictatorship, but neither do I believe in rule by majority, nor even rule by board. Together we must hear the voice of the Lord and follow it in unity.

It's the pastor's job to capture and share God's vision for the local body. Then he is responsible to train and equip the believers to walk in that vision. As that is accomplished, those with like mind and heart will come along side the pastor and a dynamic team will be formed. We need to take the time necessary to share many of the basics things we often take for granted and allow God to have control to do things His way. We need to encourage people to grow, to take the steps needed to walk and then run in the fullness of God's plans. We need to see people loved, set free, healed, equipped and then activated into service. We must welcome the prodigals and those that don't fit anywhere else. Believe it or not, God chooses the least likely and we must be part of that process. Together with them, we can see a dynamic team built.

While we should be open to people coming from other churches, if that is what God is doing, I believe ideally most if not all church growth should come from the harvest. Often when people come from other churches they bring with them the baggage or problems that they would not deal with while they were there. Further I believe that if they feel they need to switch churches, that God is leading them to a new church home, they need to make all things right and leave properly with the church's blessings.

One other concept close to the heart of the Father, is much broader than we often think about. We get so busy doing the day to day, involved with those in the immediate setting of the local church and community that we fail to see the bigger picture as He sees it. He sees the peoples of the world. He loves them as much as He loves us. He longs to see them come into the family and become parts of His Kingdom. The local church is important, but He sees a truly universal church. He longs to wrap His arms around the peoples of all nations and all ethnicities. All through the Scriptures you can catch glimpses of His longing for a people who would love and follow Him. He longs to be God to all peoples.

When God takes back His church and organizes it His way, it will see the harvest brought in worldwide. Consequently, the local church will find it is vital to raise up those people, that team, who would enable leadership along with learners to be able to go forward through whatever doors of opportunity God might open to share His truths internationally. Can you catch the vision of a local, a vibrant church, one who influences not only the local setting but also impacts the world? Can you catch the vision of not only the harvest coming in locally but also worldwide? Can you catch the vision of many other churches and ministries being birthed out of the local body? Can you catch the vision of a local church that so belongs to God that it would draw others who want to see how its done? Can you catch the vision that our lives must literally be all about Him and that then He will build His church?

If you can relate to these concepts or start to get excited about possibilities both locally and world wide, then you are in a place where God can begin to do something extraordinary. I believe His heart is to do the supernatural here and now. He is simply looking for those radically committed believers who will give their very all to see it done.

As we yield and give God control of our churches, our ministries and learn to walk in unity we shall see God build His church and the church He builds will be both relevant and one that operates in manifestations of power and love. It will be a church that has as its central focus 'It's all about Jesus' not about us or our plans but about God's plans. I believe a church like that will have the ability to allow Holy Ghost wildfire to spread widely offering hope to the hopeless, salvation to the lost, deliverance to the bound and mercy to the ones that have stumbled and not allowed back into fellowship of the body because of man-made rules.
